Pray that our church would be a place where kids and youth find community, where they learn what it means to be a part of the church, and where they are able to help usher in what comes next.

Join Congress St. and Brown St UMC for lunch on Wednesdays!


Each Wednesday we gather for a casual lunch at Pizza Hut on Farabee Drive in
